## DUNDEE 1991 FESTIVAL PROGRAMME

Once again a varied programme should ensure that the ninth Festival is not an event to be missed. Our world-wide contacts continue and we had a display of posters and programmes at the Japan International Film-Video Festival of Adventure and Sports in Hakuba from 2-6 May 1991. Our inclusion of video last year was well received with many favourable comments about the standard of projection achieved. We are therefore including video in the main programme and offering another stimulating Saturday morning. 1991 will have two in person presentations: John Dunn from Calgary and Jim Curran from Sheffield. Book early to avoid disappointment!

### FRIDAY 22 NOVEMBER

**7 - 10 pm** — SPONSORED BY 'CLIMBER AND HILLWALKER' MAGAZINE

**Bashkaus: Hard Labour in Siberia** — white water adventures from the Altai mountains of Southern Siberia.

**Stone Monkey — Portrait of a Rock Climber** — Johnny Dawes from boyhood via gritstone to spectacular 'Quarryman Groove' in Wales. "... had my palms sweating — a powerful film, — perhaps the best pure rock climbing film I have seen" Leo Dickenson. A winner of five international festival awards.

**Trans-Ellesmere Island Expedition 1990** — John Dunn will present his audio-visual lecture; the expedition, from North to South, took 96 days and covered 1250km.

### SATURDAY 23 NOVEMBER

**10 am - 12.15 pm**

A programme of videos which will include **Games Climbers Play** (Aiguille du Midi); **Strohe Ulladale** (a group of top climbers attempting Knuckle Sandwich on this impressive mountain crag in the Outer Hebrides); **White Tower Expedition 1989** (NW Greenland).

**2 pm - 5 pm**

**Underground Eiger** — record breaking caving under the Yorkshire Dales.

**The Logan Run** — remarkable film of two expeditions in 1925 and 1990 to climb the highest mountain in Canada; three adventurers take their 24 strong husky-dog team to the summit! Made by Chameleon Television Ltd and recently shown on Channel 4.

**Buoux** — see Johnny Dawes (again!), Jerry Moffat, and Ben Moon in action on these famous limestone cliffs in Southern France — includes Moon on 'Agincourt', the world's first 8c! "... the best sports climbing footage I've ever seen, it's excellent." Joe Brown.

**7 pm - 10 pm** — SPONSORED BY GRAHAM TISO, WHITEHALL STREET, DUNDEE

**Jim Curran**, one of Britain's best-known mountaineers with a wealth of experience in many parts of the world — mountain photography, filming, writing and lecturing. Many will be familiar with his film and book of the tragic events on K2 in 1986. This year has seen his autobiography 'Suspended Sentences'. Jim is keen for the Kendal Festival to rise again like a phoenix and anxious to learn what he can from Dundee!

Jim will introduce **The Bat** — his famous film made on the Ben but rarely seen in Scotland since it was made; make some incomparable comments on mountain photography; then introduce parts of his **K2** film and **Kongur**. Don't miss this chance to meet one of the world's leading mountaineering cameramen.

## 1991 Exhibitions

### Great White Tower Expedition

An exhibition to North West Greenland in summer of 1989. The area — UPER NIVIK ISLAND — was described by Tilman as the "Most beautiful island in Greenland". The expedition objectives were to make several climbs of local peaks as well as collect images of the remote area.

The paintings and photographs on display will be the work of David Wilson, expedition member, well known for the Sickle Moon Expedition.

### The International Trans Antarctic Expedition

An exhibition which traversed the Antarctic "on foot" in 1990, the objective being international co-operation, and research into global warming.

Team members included a Frenchman, a Japanese, a Russian, an American, a Brit and husky dogs.

There was extensive work done in schools related to this expedition in the data and communications fields. The exhibition at the Festival will display the equipment used by the British Team member Geoff Somers which will include a full Antarctic camp.

In addition there will be displays of some of John Dunn's photography from his "Arctic Light" collection and Jim Curran has also agreed to exhibit some of his photographic collection.

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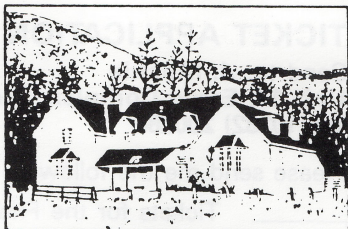

1. The competition will be judged in private by a panel of judges, appointed by the Film Festival Committee.
2. Photographs must have been taken by the entrant but need not have been processed by him. They should preferably be of recent origin, previously unpublished and should not have been entered for this competition before.
3. Prize sponsors reserve the right to use winning entries for publicity purposes.
4. All entries should bear the entrant's name and category No. If the label is fixed to the bottom of the slide as it is viewed when held in the hand right way up, the task of the judges and projectionist will be greatly eased.
5. The Committee undertake to handle all entries with the utmost care but can accept no responsibility for actual damage.
6. Entries should be in the hands of Alf Ingram (address below) by Saturday 25th October. **Each entrant should supply a stamped addressed envelope to facilitate the safe return of their slide(s) or print(s).**
7. An individual may enter only once in each category.  
**There will be an entry fee of 50p per category. (except category 6). Cheque/P.O. (no stamps) payable to Dundee Mountain Film Festival.**
8. Entry dimensions: slides, 35mm only; colour print, 8" × 10" (minimum) - 12" × 15" (maximum); black and white print, 8" × 10" (minimum) - 12" × 15" (maximum); All prints unmounted.
9. Category 5. — Personal Folio should consist of one set of 6 slides on the nominated theme.
10. Category 6 — Club Folio should consist of one set of 6 slides on the nominated theme.  
There will be no entry fee in this category.
11. Any Category (except cat. 6) receiving less than 5 entries will be withdrawn from the competition.

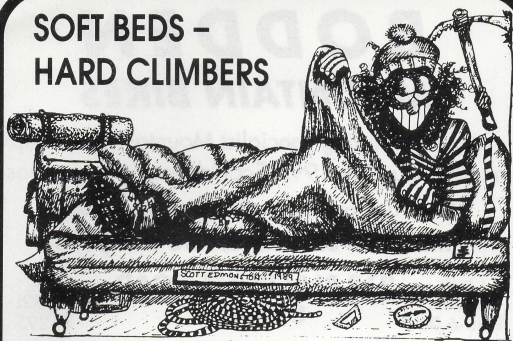

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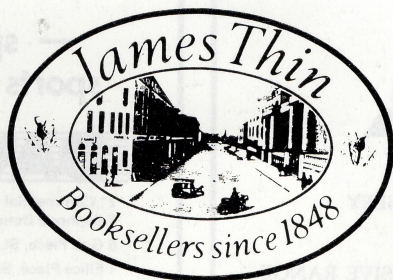
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### MUNRO BASH 1992 - BOOK NOW
