The Dundee Mountain Film Festival is the UK's longest continuous running mountain film festival. The Festival showcases an international programme of speakers, as well as award winning films and exhibitions, held in Discovery Point, and Bonar Hall, Dundee. 2016 will present two evening programmes on 24th and 25th, and a full day programme on the 26th Nov, all featuring films and personal appearances.

The 25th and 26th will have a full supporting exhibition of art, photography, trade and voluntary organisations stands and displays. Come and enjoy this unmissable opportunity to see, hear, and experience outstanding stories of courage, adventure, and exploration.

This special evening will present a unique opportunity of conversation, recollection and inspiration with Jamie Andrew the incredible Scottish amputee mountaineer.

The evening opens with four inspiring films from the Banff World Tour, including "A Line Across The Sky" which describes the first dramatic achievement of the long considered impossible Fitz Traverse in Patagonia. Greg Boswell, known as the "future of Scottish winter climbing", will describe the epic challenges he has undertaken to earn this title.

Youthful inspiration, defying disability, and the mountain bike phenomenon feature in four thought provoking films. Robin Campbell will survey the outstanding worldwide achievements of renowned Scottish mountaineer Harold Raeburn.

The second programme from the Banff World Tour will screen seven films in which pushing the limits is the norm – except there is no norm. Felicity Aston is the first lady to

ski the Antarctic alone. Starting in November 2011, Felicity set off from the coast on the Ross Ice Shelf to complete the 1744km (1084 mile) journey on the opposite coast 59 days later, experiencing crushing solitude, emotional turmoil and mental hardships on a daily basis.

Re-enacting the pioneering days of climbing, describing the motivation of todays generation, and making the most of Scotlands late snow ski mountaineering opportunities. Three intriguing films. Andy Kirkpatrick will talk about a life of quite extraordinary big wall climbs and winter expeditions. The motivation, the psychology, the risk, and the madness, of a life on the edge.

19.40 A LINE ACROSS THE SKY

Film USA, 2015, (40 Mins) Filmmakers: Peter Mortimer, Josh Lowell

Long considered impossible, coveted by many and attempted by a few, the Fitz Traverse has fueled the imaginations of climbers in Patagonia for decades. Tracing the iconic skyline of Cerro Fitz Roy and its six satellite peaks, it spans four miles and 13,000 feet across snow and ice-covered rock, with epic route finding and endless rapelling. Seizing their chance during a rare extended weather window, Tommy Caldwell and Alex Honnold went big. The pair completed the first traverse in a five-day push during February 2014.

Pushed to their limits, the group challenge society's perceptions of "disability" and bring the lesser known discipline of paraclimbing to the world stage, by achieving something many thought impossible.


10.17 HANNAH BARNES – NORTHWEST

Raeburn's achievements in these areas were remarkable, and mark him as one of the most successful British mountaineers of his era.

Film USA, 2015, (21 mins) Filmmakers: Peter Mortimer, Josh Lowell 24 Hours of Horseshoe Hell is a climbing competition that has you climbing day and night, racking up points for your climbs as you go. You just have to beat Alex Honnold. How hard can it be?

15.59 - FELICITY ASTON: ALONE IN ANTARCTICA

16.59 At the end of November 2011, Felicity set off from the coast of Antarctica on the Ross Ice Shelf to cross the entire continent on skis by herself. Ahead of her was a 1744km (1084 mile) to the South Pole then on to the opposite coast. Not with standing the extreme physical challenges of the 59-day journey, it was the mental hardships that Felicity endured that are the most memorable. Crushing solitude and emotional turmoil on a daily basis resulted in an appreciation of the details of the environment, and a rather strange relationship with the sun!

Film UK, 2015 (30 mins) Filmmakers: FinalCrux Films Professional climber Robbie Phillips talks about his background in the sport, from his humble beginnings climbing trees to competing for team GB in international competitions.

19.35 **LATE**

Film UK, 2015, (44 mins) Filmmaker: James Mullner

With twenty days in May to plan and execute an end of season ski and snowboard escapade in Scottish backcountry, a group of friends contended with classic Scottish storms whilst lugging their body weight in gear to some of Scotland's loftiest summits. Their efforts were well rewarded, however, through enjoying some exceptional conditions and terrain.

20.49 - ANDY KIRKPATRICK - THE LONELINESS OF THE LONG DISTANCE SOLOIST

21.49 Andy Kirkpatrick specialises in pitting himself against vertical climbs of over 1000 metres often in temperatures as low as minus 30 degrees. Andy's achievements include scaling Yosemite's El Capitan over twenty four times, completing a 15 day winter ascent of the West face of the Dru, and making the first ascent of the South Ridge of Ulvertanna, Antarctica, spending 14 days at minus thirty and colder to reach the top. Remarkably just fourteen days later with frost bitten toes he led TV presenter Alex Jones

up Moonlight Buttress in Zion for Sports Relief, raising £1.5 million pounds. Four winter expeditions to Patagonia, a crossing of Greenland, and to many nights spent suffering to mention have brought new meaning to the words 'epic' and 'cold'! With the ability to talk in a way that enables all levels of enthusiast to experience the risk and tension of big wall climbing, Andy will present a memorable evening.
