WELCOME TO THE 25th DUNDEE MOUNTAIN FILM FESTIVAL

The Dundee Mountain Film Festival originated in 1983 with a programme of 5 films screened in the Bonar Hall, to raise money for the Roy Tait Memorial Fund. The success of the event ensured the building of a memorial bridge at Bachnagairn.

Now in it's 25th year, the Festival goes from strength to strength with an exciting and varied line up of films, speakers and exhibitions from around the world.

This year's special guests are Andy Cave, Will Gadd, Børge Ousland, Marko Prezelj, Stephen Venables, Neil Barlow (Artist) and Peter Sandground (photographer). A unique feature of the Dundee event is that it is non-competitive. Running in parallel with the film screenings and in-person presentations are the mountain art and photography displays and trade exhibits from voluntary and retail organisations.

Andy Cave's lecture will take place on Wednesday 21st November at the Tower Lecture Theatre. Dundee Contemporary Arts (DCA) cinema will be screening elements from St Kilda – A European Opera on the evening of Thursday 22nd November, and on Saturday morning, 24th November, there will be a screening of Fatima's Hand as part of DCA's Movie Kids programme.

Come, see and hear fantastic stories of courage, adventure and exploration and enjoy the 25th year of Dundee Mountain Film Festival.




19.30 WILD CLIMBS: CZECH REPUBLIC Film UK, 1999, 30 min Produced and Directed by Richard Else

20.30 ST KILDA - A EUROPEAN OPERA

Film elements from a remarkable event earlier this year which was performed simultaneously in Austria, Belgium, France, Germany and in Studio Alba, in Stornoway. A 30 minute piece about the dancers working on the cliffs and a 10 minute film which describes the whole project. Followed by discussion with the film makers.

19.00 CRESTA

Film UK, 1950's, 29 min Produced by Air Ministry, London

Two members of Kinloss Mountain Rescue Team on an epic ascent of Cresta on Ben Nevis. This classic black and white movie has leader 'Sullivan' at times climbing only with 'moral support'!

19.40 DUET AND DEATH ON ST KILDA Films UK, 2006, 7 min & 5 min Produced and Directed by Keith Partridge

Choreographed pieces from the filming of the BBC global production earlier this year on life on St Kilda before the 1930 evacuation.

19.55 PATAGONIA – A TRAVEL TO THE END OF THE WORLD

Film Norway, 2006, 40 min Produced and Directed by Vebjorn Hagen

Børge Ousland and Thomas Ulrich attempt the first unsupported traverse of the Southern Patagonia Icecap (third largest in the world). After three days of paddling into the Patagonian fjords, they reach the bottom of the Jorge Montt Glacier. From here they carry their equipment up and start skiing across the ice cap. A film about the spirit of adventure.

21.05 to 22.10 BØRGE OUSLAND 'AGAINST ALL ODDS TO THE NORTH POLE IN WINTER'

Børge Ousland has established himself as one of the leading polar explorers of our time. After more than two months of complete darkness, dangerously drifting ice, polar bears, and minus 40 degree conditions, Ousland and his partner Mike Horn reach the geographic North Pole. Their expedition breaks one of the last barriers in polar exploration, being the first to reach the pole, unsupported, during the Arctic winter.

Film Germany, 2006, 38 min Directed by Jens Hoffmann

A 27 year old woman from Norway plans to climb and BASE jump off an imposing mountain in one of the most remote and poorest areas of Mali, West Africa. The project does not work out as planned. It turns into a risky adventure and opens the eyes of the filmmakers and athletes to a different reality.

09.30 TYROL — LAND IN THE MOUNTAINS Film Austria 2001, 10 min Produced and Directed by Georg Riha

Images of the Tyrolean Alps by Georg Riha combined with piano music composed by Philip Glass ('Koyaanisqarsi') form a symphony, a declaration of love for the beauty of the Tyrolean landscape.

09.45 BEYOND IRAO

Film USA, 2005, 8 min Produced by Annalisa Hodgkins and Directed by Tom Eldridge

Five newly disabled Iraqi veterans travel to the Rocky Mountains to participate in an adaptive winter sports programme. The veterans are at first sceptical, not wanting to cause more harm to their bodies. However, they are soon experiencing the freedom and adventure of skiing and snowboarding.

09.55 RIDE OF THE MERGANSERS

Film USA, 2004, 11 min Produced by Steve Fuman The hooded merganser is a reclusive duck found only in North America. Every spring, in the Great Lakes region, the wary hen lays and incubates her eggs in a nest high in the trees. Just 24 hours after hatching, the tiny ducklings must make the perilous leap to the ground below to begin life in the wild. This age old rite is rarely observed by humans. 'Ride of the

Mergansers' brings this hidden drama to the screen.

Ten years ago Will Gadd flew over the Grand Canyon at 30,000 feet in a jet and thought, 'Hey, I wonder if you could fly a paraglider over that monster?'

Will Gadd and Ben Firth are two top Canadian ice climbers. They thought climbing 'awesome' bergs


would be a lot of fun, so the Aweberg trip was born.

11.20 to 12.30 WILL GADD 'THE DOCUMENTARY MYTH - HOW WE REALLY MAKE ADVENTURE TV EXPLAINED'

World-class, multi-talented athlete, climbing champion and adventurer Will Gadd of Canmore, Alberta holds the world paragliding open distance record. In May 2001, Gadd and fellow pilots left Ventura California on a 2,800 mile paragliding expedition across America, finally landing in Kitty Hawk, North Carolina, site of the Wright Brothers first flight. Will's presentation is a behind the scenes look at making films about climbing icebergs, paragliding, and other sports. Do the rock stars wear makeup (Exposed!)? Occasional coarse language, and ego deflation, not appropriate for those who believe everything they see on the TV screen.

'Roam' is a mountain-bike film that follows the travels of the world's top riders as they explore new places to ride, and visit some of the notorious mecca's of mountain biking.

14.25 MOUNTAINS WITHOUT BARRIERS

Film USA, 2006, 24 min Produced by Mark Wellman and David D'Angelo and Directed by Michael Brown Two blind men and a man with no legs tackle a 1,000 foot rock tower in Italy. They are here as part of a festival called 'No Barriers', whose principal aim is to facilitate knowledge exchange between people with disabilities and improving the efficiency of current rehabilitation approaches.

Snowboarding without the use of bindings. The sport of snowboarding was started by skate boarders and surfers looking for a winter alternative to the two summer sports. Now there is only one way to change snowboarding, and that is to take the bindings off and surf the mountain.

Marko Prezelj and Steve House film a one day ascent of a new route on the west face of Cayesh in Peru. 'Our wish is to present a real taste of modern lightweight alpinism by today's best alpinists'.

The elegant, granite Cobra crack in Squamish, British Columbia is perhaps the hardest crack climb in the

world and Swiss climber Didier Berthod is among the world's best crack climbers. Far from the spotlight, Didier spends months in his epic quest to capture the first ascent.



MARKO PREZELJ 'BASED ON TRUE STORIES'

Alpinist Magazine once said about Marko 'More than one young climber has found himself doing the best route of his life when tied in with Marko Prezelj.' Opinionated, hungry and the purist's purist, the Slovenian alpinist has a simple piece of advice: 'have fun'. Born in Ljubljana in 1965, Marko moved from first encounters with the 'old school' of alpinism to create his own style which he admits is his obsession. 'In climbing, style is my first concern....no regrets is the rule. It is considered normal to avoid the uncertain, the unexpected and the unknown but these are the catalysts for human progress and they're my catalyst as well'.
