21.00 Mick Tighe Royal Marine Mountain and Arctic warfare instructer, British and International Mountain Guide, three decades a Mountain Rescue team member imcluding 10 years as the

National Training Officer of all Scottish MRT's, now finds time to indulge his passion for Scotland's cliffs and sea stacks (resulting in many first ascents in the process), when cross country ski trips to Arctic Norway are not in season. In addition, what started as Micks personal interest in mountainering memorablia has evolved into the Scottish Mountain Heritage Collection a large unique trove of international mountaineering artefacts which Mick, as chairman of the charity, hosts in a dedicated stone barn attached to his and his wife Kathy's house. Mick's encyclopedic knowledge of mountaineering history, particularly Scotland, will enthral through the medium of a number of archival films, Mick's narrative accompanied by live music specially composed and presented by Steven Gellatly and Denis Shepherd.





Steve Gellatly is a Dundee based scientist by day and composer/pianist by night. Steve has written, and performed live, numerous scores for silent films, appearing at a wide range of venues both in Scotland and abroad, recently collaborating with the late Brian Johnstone to compose music in response to Brian's poetry collection The Marks on the Map. Currently, Steve is focusing on composing for documentary films, but has taken time out to write a piece especially for this evening's programme.



Aberdonian Denis Shepherd has been a regular competitor in traditional Scottish music competitions for many years, winning trophies for singing, verse, mouth-organ, tune-writing and song-writing as well as for diddling (mouth music) a talent he will perform as accompaniment to part of the film programme — an emotive reminder of days gone by when attempts at diddling filled many a dark evening in a remote mountain bothy.

19.00 MANEUVERS

Film USA 2019. 4mins. Producer – Josh Berman. Director – Sami Ortlieb Athlete and musician Sämi Ortlieb has produced some of the most creative segments in skiing ever. For the 2019 season he rounded up a motley crew of riders to create a segment unlike anything that has ever been done before.

BLUEPRINT

Film Canada 2021. 9mins. Directors – Scott Bell, Mark Mathews In 'Blueprint' you'll experience a mountain bike trail coming to life before your very eyes, whilst exploring the motivations behind the builders' creative expression.

THE FORTRESS GHOSTS

Film Canada 2021. 10 mins. Director - Bryan Smith, Cameron Sylvester When Fortress Mountain, Alberta closed in 2004 a once vibrant ski resort quickly became a remnant of the past. Today little remains standing, but the relict structures hold stories of ski culture and community. A historic past but what is the future for this once iconic destination.

TRUSTFALL

Film Norway 2021. 11mins. Director - Stefan Witts.

A world class duo of wingsuit flyers attempt to complete a routine of moves on a mountainside half the height of the intended altitude of 3000m. Large walls in all directions and a narrow window for completion, set this ultimate trust of partnership.

THE HIGH ROAD

Film Canada 2021. 16mins. Director - Keith Robertson In the summer of 2020, Dwayne Wohlgemuth became the first person ever to walk the entire 800 km of the Thelon Esker - the longest in the world stretching across the remote Barren Lands of Canada's Northwest Territories. During his 40-day hike, Dwayne did have several encounters - but none were with humans.

A WOMAN'S PLACE

Film UK 2021. 27mins. Director – Menna Wakeford A funny, heart-warming conversation with The Pinnacle Club as they celebrate their centenary highlighting women's longstanding involvement in climbing, and aiming to rebalance a narrative which has been primarily about men.

THE FARMER

Film USA 2021. 4mins. Director – Michael James Brown The Farmer spends his winters harvesting one of the most precious crops on earth "Powder". A local legend in the Wasatch Mountains, this film explores how his passion for efficiency and sustainability were utilized to maximize a lifetime of skiing.



THE PROCESS

Film UK 2021. 15mins. Director - Matt Pycroft

Tom Randall is known for the outrageous challenges he sets himself. This time it's the Lakes Classic Rock Challenge and a Bob Graham link up - that's 15 classic Lakeland rock climbs, 42 summits, and 142km - in 24 hours. But what lengths is he willing to go to achieve his goal?

Lake District based Helen Mort is an award winning poet and novelist being shortlisted for the T.S. Eliot Prize, the Banff Mountain Literature Award, and the Boardman Tasker Prize. Helen, who has had her work published in both Climb and The Alpinist, is currently editor of "Lake District Trail Running". Her keen enthusiasm for fell running and rock climbing has taken her to Squamish, Kalymnos, the Rockies and Greenland, but at "home" most of her climbing is on Peak District gritstone. The East Mounth Munros lie south of the River Dee and east of Glenshee. Dundee runners Amy Gilligan and Dominic Williams set off to run all of 14 – in less than 24 hours. Mission accomplished?

HOUSE OF THE GODS

Film UK 2021. 44mins. Director - Matt Pycroft

The great northern prow of Mount Roraima soars from the depths of the Amazon rainforest guarded by vertical jungle, overhanging cliffs and 100km of untracked jungle face Leo Houlding and team just to reach the desperately steep face, before attempting to gain the summit which local legend has it that only those of pure soul will ever see.

ALAN HINKES OBE - HIMALAYAN EXPLOITS

When Alan Hinkes completed his Challenge 8000 by summiting all 14 of the world's highest mountains, not only was he the first Briton to do so, he joined a high-risk exclusive club of only twelve people alive who had reached the top of all 8000m peaks - that is the same number of people who have stood on the moon I. Alan began his mountaineering career whilst at Northallerton Grammar School, North Yorkshire, progressing to the Alps with ascents of many difficult mountains, including the notorious North Face of the Eiger, eventually graduating to the Himalaya and Karakorum. An accomplished cameraman, author, and strong environmentalist Alan was awarded the OBE in the 2006, and living in North Yorkshire can be regularly

seen there, or in the Lake District, tramping the fells and moors, clinging to a rock face, climbing a frozen waterfall, or disappearing into a pot hole or cave.
